Next HUSH! meeting

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday 24th February. **We will be meeting in the main foyer at the Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts (SCVA), at UEA for a 1:30pm start.** We will be having a tour of the main collection, and the cost for this is **£3 per person.** After the formal tour, you are welcome to look around by yourself, or to meet me in the SCVA cafe for a coffee (in which case, please remember to bring a little extra to buy a drink). It would be helpful to know if you plan to attend this trip, but if you decide to join us at the last minute, that will be ok.

Parking: **Please allow good time for parking.** There are 4 disabled parking spaces outside the gallery. There are then a series of small pay and display car parks within 5 minute walk of SCVA (no more than £2 per hour). The main car park (£1 per hour) is about a 10 minute walk across the campus. There are also lots of buses that take you right onto campus. Ask the driver to drop you at the stop closest to the Sainsbury Centre. I would recommend using these if you want to avoid finding a parking space!
